#### Writing tools and supports


#### In the Middle Ages the books were handwritten.

- Writing tools:
  - quill or reed pen
  - ink
  - small knife (for recutting the quill and erasing)
  - lead stylus (for lining)
- Writing supports:
  - parchment (types, hair/flesh side)
  - papyrus (fiber direction)
  - paper (watermark)



#### Technical limitations of writing

- writing support is expensive, the space is limited
- the quill cannot write upward
- to avoid ink blotches and to write cursive, letters have terminations
- the erasure may destroy the support
- sometimes the poor quality parchment has defects
- some inks affect the support (e.g.  $Cu_2O$ )
- sometimes the writing is obstructed by later writings (glosses, palimpsests)

In deciphering the handwriting, the most important is the determination of the dynamics of the traces which make up the letter = ductus



















